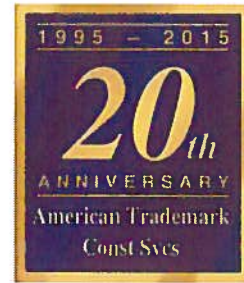

Building new homes and giving them to deserving veterans (mortgage free) will be our first step in our effort to accomplish that goal. ATCS is committed to building the first "Wounded Warrior Project" in Butler Township in 2015. We have already committed the finances to build the home and have asked a charitable organization called "Operation Finally Home" to help us do the interviewing and selection of veterans who are truly in need and qualify for a new home. The vetting process may be the most difficult part of the entire project. Fortunately, the "Operation Finally Home" organization has already done over 60 of these types of wounded warrior projects in 15 states. We are counting on their guidance and past experience to help us build this project as efficiently and fairly as possible.

We have asked Lee Kirgan, with the "Operation Finally Home" organization, to meet with us on Friday, January 30th to begin organizing the project and initiate the selection process that will assist us in identifying the veteran or veterans who will benefit from our wounded warrior project.
